

WHY DO I NEED TO DO BLOOD TESTS?

Some diseases and infections can be transmitted through breastmilk. Although they are eliminated during the pasteurisation process, blood tests ensure the absence of any of these infections before pasteurisation.

If donating to the Mothers Milk Bank Charity over a long period of time, you may also be required to undergo further blood tests.

These will be required at three monthly intervals.

These blood tests can be arranged through your attending physician or GP.



BLOOD TESTS REQUIRED

Mothers Milk Bank Charity is required by law to ensure the confidentiality of its donor mothers.

HUMAN IMMUNODEFICIENCY VIRUS (HIV) HIV is responsible for AIDS (Acquired Immune Deficiency Syndrome). AIDS is the name given to a collection of diseases that develop because the body's immune system breaks down. It is possible to carry HIV for many years without becoming ill.

HEPATITIS B & C VIRUSES (HEP B & C)

Hep B and C are viruses that infect the liver cells and can cause inflammation of the liver.

HUMAN T-CELL LEUKEMIA VIRUS TYPES 1 8 2 (HTLV 1 8 2) HTLV 1 and 2 are most common in Southern Japan, the Caribbean, parts of Africa, South America, and south-eastern USA. Many people who carry these viruses may display no symptoms even though they will be infectious.

SYPHILIS

A sexually transmitted bacterial infection.

CYTOMEGALOVIRUS (CMV)

Blood tests for CMV are required, even though this virus is destroyed on freezing and through pasteurisation.

These infections can be passed on in a number of ways:

- Through unprotected sexual intercourse
- Through the sharing of needles
- Via blood transfusions
- Via breastmilk
- Via tattoos and body piercing if nonsterile equipment is used
